

# **Instructions - Values with Puppets Lesson**

## Activity 1: Guess what I like doing?

- Make a circle in the room.
- One student is chosen to act out an activity. The student acts out something they like to do, e.g. playing the guitar, getting a surprise, riding a bike, climbing trees, swimming, playing handball.
- You have to try to guess what the student is acting out.
- After three guesses, the acting student says what the action is.
- Student to the left of the student that was acting now has a turn to act.
- Game continues around the circle.

#### Activity 2: What are values?

Answer: They are principles or standards of behaviour; one's judgement of what is important in life. Examples: considerate, listening, compassionate, respectful, team player, learner, kindness, care, gratitude, trust, fairness, honesty.

- What are some values?
- What are some values in your family or religion?
- What is a value that is important to you?
- How do you or your family act out these values?

#### **Activity 3:**

- Pick a puppet from your teacher or you can make one.

#### Activity 4:

- Make a group of 3 or 4 students.
- Create a puppet show based on a value word.

**Example:** 'Care/Caring'\_- students could base a performance around a situation where a person was caring, such as not leaving anyone behind when they are walking and making sure they are waiting for all their classmates.

- Brainstorm your ideas by completing the <u>Drama Performance Planner</u>.
- You have 10-15 minutes to practise the performance.
- Perform in front of the class.



## **Activity 5:**

- What message did you want to send the audience?
- How did you get the message across regarding your value?
- How did you come up with the ideas?
- Tell us more about your characters.
- What parts did the audience like best?

# **Activity 6:**

- How did it make you feel to act out your value?
- Is the value you acted out a value that is important to you?
- Why is this value important to you?
- What value do you think best describes you?
- How does your value enrich the lives of others?
- When you help someone, could you also be teaching them something?
- How does the value they learn from you help others?
