

Scenario Discussion Points:

Note: Numbers relate to drama scenario cards

- 1. Who knows how to play basketball? Who taught you how to play? Why might someone not know how to play?
- 2. Why might a student not want to go back to class?
 - Some students find it hard to not finish a game or sequence of things they are doing.
- 3. Do you remember when you first came to school and had to learn your way around? Who showed you?
- 4. If you know how to play soccer who taught you? Or how did you learn?
- 5. Why might someone (teacher or student) not hear the bell?
 - This might be due to older age, having an ear infection, having a cold/flu or auditory processing disorder or congenital hearing impairment.
- 6. Reasons for not knowing how to make friends? Does anyone else find this tricky?
 - They may not have had the chance to spend time with other people much before, or do not know how to start a conversation with someone new.
- 7. Why do you think someone might not be able to use the stairs?
 - They might have a broken leg, sprained ankle or use a wheelchair etc.
- 8. Why may someone want to play a game without talking?
 - Students who may want some quiet while they play, students who like miming, students who are non verbal, a student who likes the quiet so they can concentrate on the game better. Often students also like to play alongside others but not necessarily with them.
- 9. Why may a person not speak the same language as you?
 - Cultural differences, students with different language-speaking families, students who are from refugee or immigrant backgrounds. Wouldn't it be great to learn more about someone else's culture!
- 10. What are the rules of handball?
 - Are there certain ways you use your hand to hit the ball?



- 11. Does any one person or team win all the time?
 - No. Playing a game isn't really about winning but more about the fun of playing. Spending time with others and improving on your own skills.
- 12. Why might someone not know what game to play?
 - They might be having a hard time choosing from so many games or might be bored with the games available.
- 13. We all lose things or forget things sometimes. Could you ask someone to help you find them?
 It could be a lunchbox, toy, jumper, shoes, socks.

Reflection:

Remind the class that we all need assistance, ideas or help sometimes. Whether it be in the playground, in the class, or outside of school.

- Maybe Johnny found Alice's lunch box she lost by quickly zooming through the playground on his wheelchair.
- Grace is really excited because she didn't know what game to play and was bored with the others. Then Advika, a student from another country, taught her a new game, which they played together.
- Laf showed the new student Jesse around the school and then Jessie taught him how to play handball. They both made a new friend.
- Shari, who didn't know how to make friends, helped Kia up the stairs, and then they sat and drew on her cast together.
