Activity 1:

- 1. Let's talk about stories!
- What are some of your favourite stories?
- Who can think of a story and tell me what happens?
- Can you tell me what the beginning, the middle and the end of the story are?
- Why is a story made like this?

Picture 1:

- What do you think is happening in this story?
- What do you think the black line represents here?

Picture 2:

- Is this what you thought the story was about? Why/Why not?
- What did you notice about the structure of the story?
- 2. Now try to write your own story on the piece of paper.

Activity 2:

- 1. Get into a group of 3-4.
- 2. Look at the character card given to you and read their biography.
- 3. Your group will get a scenario.
- 4. Talk about your scenario and decide who your characters are in the scene.
- 5. Use the prompt questions to plan your performance.
- 6. Fill out the <u>Drama Performance Planner</u> with your group.

Now let's talk about your script!

- Can all characters participate the same way in the scenario?
- If not, what can you change in your script to make sure everyone can participate?
- Do you think all characters feel the same in the situation?
- Can you identify any successes and challenges characters might face in this scene in relation to access to the environment or interaction with other characters? (e.g. a character could feel left out of the soccer game due to having a broken ankle)
- How can this be addressed and how can you make adjustments for each character? (e.g. the soccer game could be changed to a throwing game to include the character with a broken ankle).
- If a character does not look or sound like you, do you think they would act, feel or think the same as you in this situation?
- If this was the real world situation, whose responsibility would it be to make sure everyone is included and feels comfortable?
- 7. Your group has 15 minutes to rehearse and change your script.
- 8. Perform your play for the class.
- 9. After each performance talk about:
 - What worked well (WWW).....
 - Even Better if (EBI).....
